Course content

The syllabus covered all the four skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening; the three systems of vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation, plus sessions on classroom management, including dealing with mixed ability, CALL (computer assisted language learning), a cultural visit to a museum and how this could be used for project work.

The sessions were based on practical ideas where various tasks were tried out and evaluated in relation to current teaching methods. These ideas included warmers, presentation and practice activities and ways in which to use both course book and authentic material in order to motivate students. Materials were also created that could be taken away and used in the classroom.

Differences in education systems were also discussed along with current topical issues and teaching resources related to each teacher's individual situation. The variety of experience and teaching situations within the group allowed us all to benefit greatly from the sharing of ideas, leading to a very productive experience overall.
